

Request for Applications:  
AB 617 North-Imperial Steering Committee Participants Needed

Climate change legislation, Assembly Bill 617, was passed in the summer of 2017 to improve air quality in California while reducing emissions, specifically in disadvantaged communities highly exposed to air pollution hotspots and most vulnerable to public health risks attributed to poor air quality. Through proper implementation, California is setting the model by devising a coordinated effort in reducing emissions through community informed action and air district engagement. In doing so, the following goals must be met: 1) Development of community air monitoring technology and 2) emissions reductions programs.

The development and establishment of Community Air Monitoring Networks is essential to the success of AB 617 implementation. The purpose of these air monitoring networks is to measure particulate matter and toxic air contaminants. These networks present the opportunity for community involved action and citizen science to lead and will serve as the model for the rest of the state to follow.

AB 617 designates new actions to be completed by California's air districts through the *Community Air Protection Program* and sets aside new resources for air districts to achieve the legislature's goal's. The Imperial County Air Pollution Control District is seeking applicants to become members of the North-Imperial Steering Committee which will:

- Voice concerns and inform regulators of problem areas within the community that need to be addressed
- Participate in engaging the public at large about efforts of community air monitoring and emissions reductions
- Provide input to assist in identifying possible emission reduction strategies and projects
- Assist in defining metrics to track progress.

Qualifications for steering committee members:

- Reside, work, or own business within the North-Imperial community (Brawley-Westmorland-Calipatria), as defined by the Community Air Protection (CAP) Program(s) and CAP Blueprint
- Individual, Community-Based Organization, affected sources, or local government bodies
