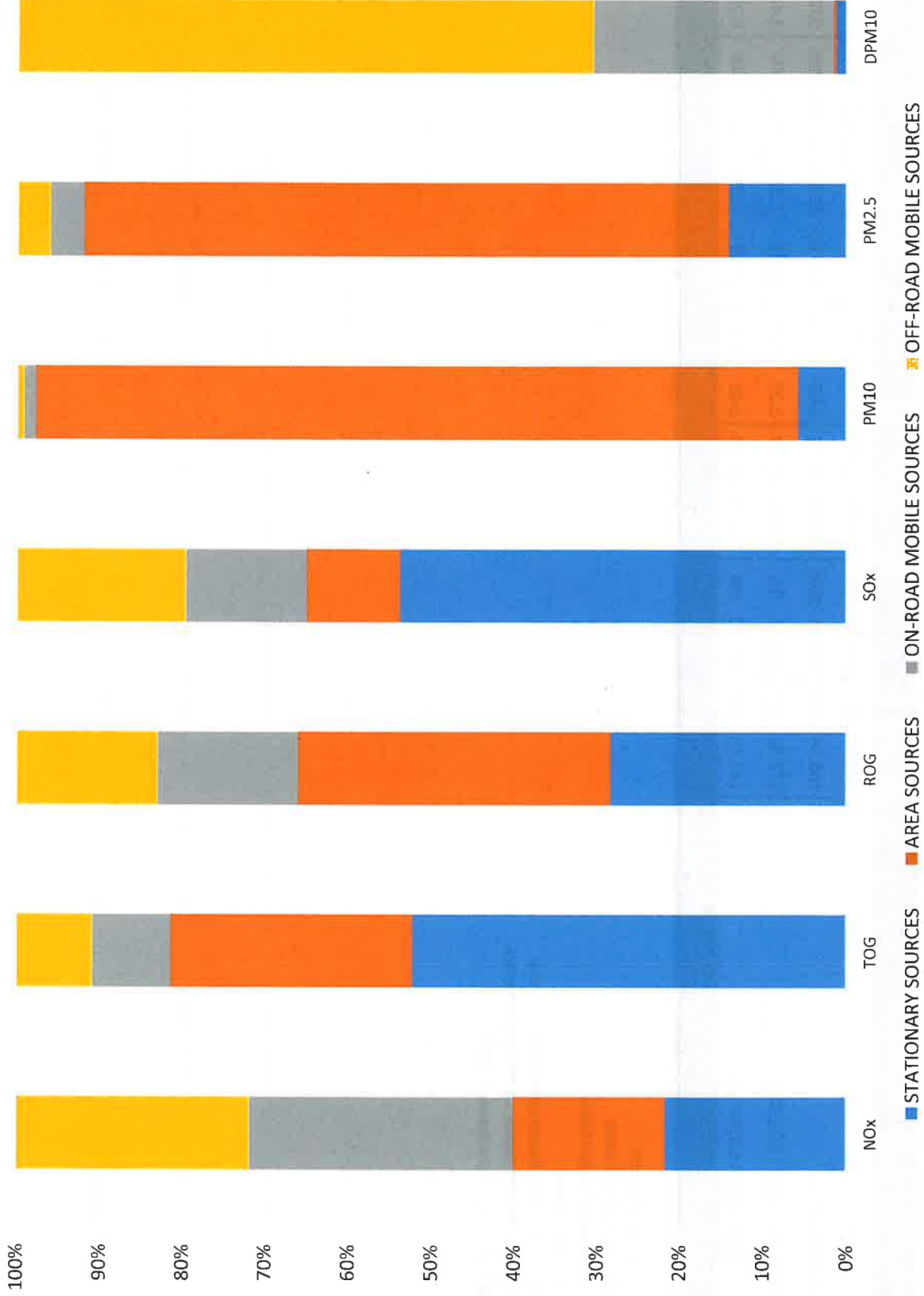

They are calculated by multiplying mass emissions by a toxicity factor (e.g. cancer unit risk factor) as determined by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment.

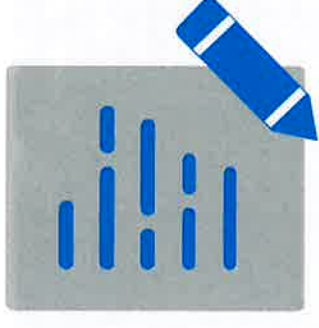

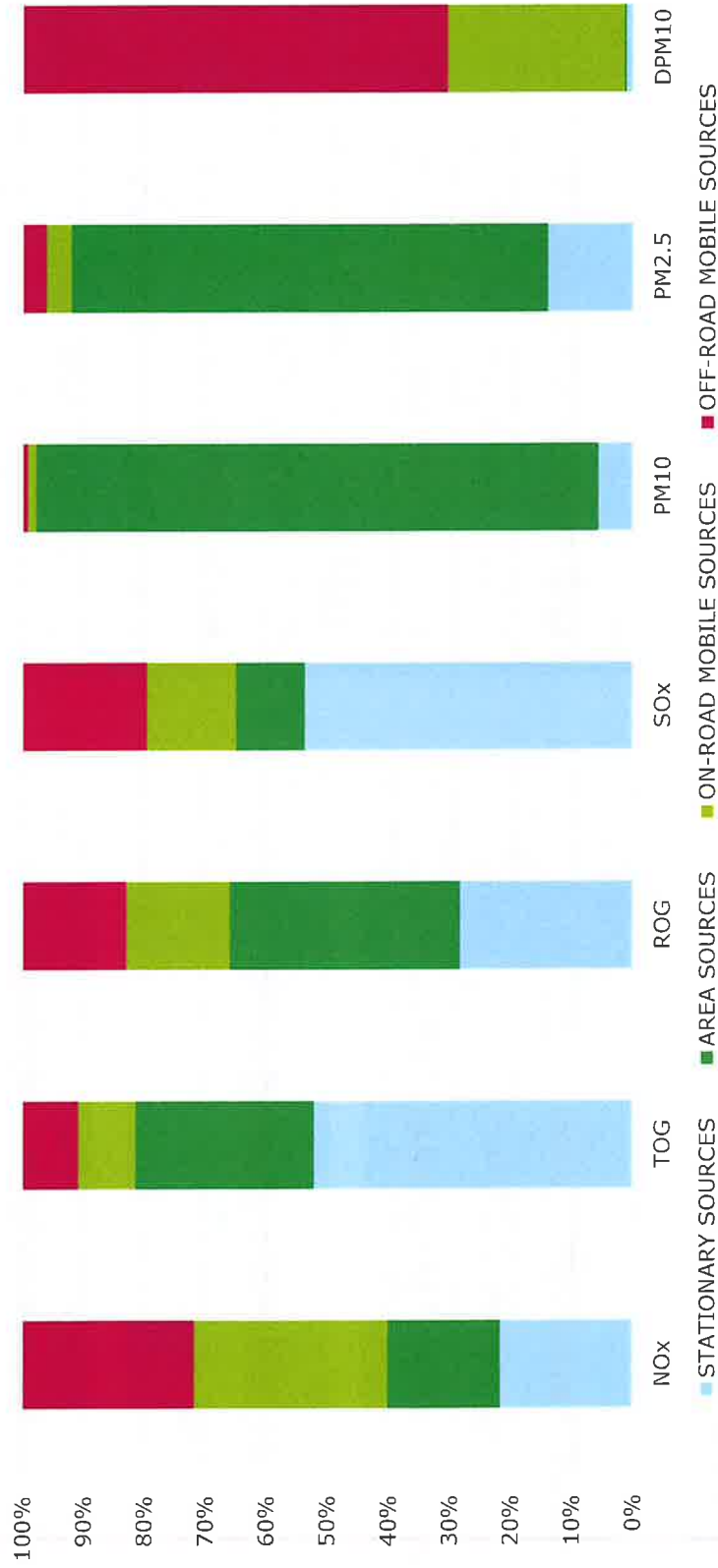

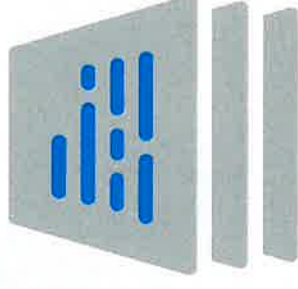

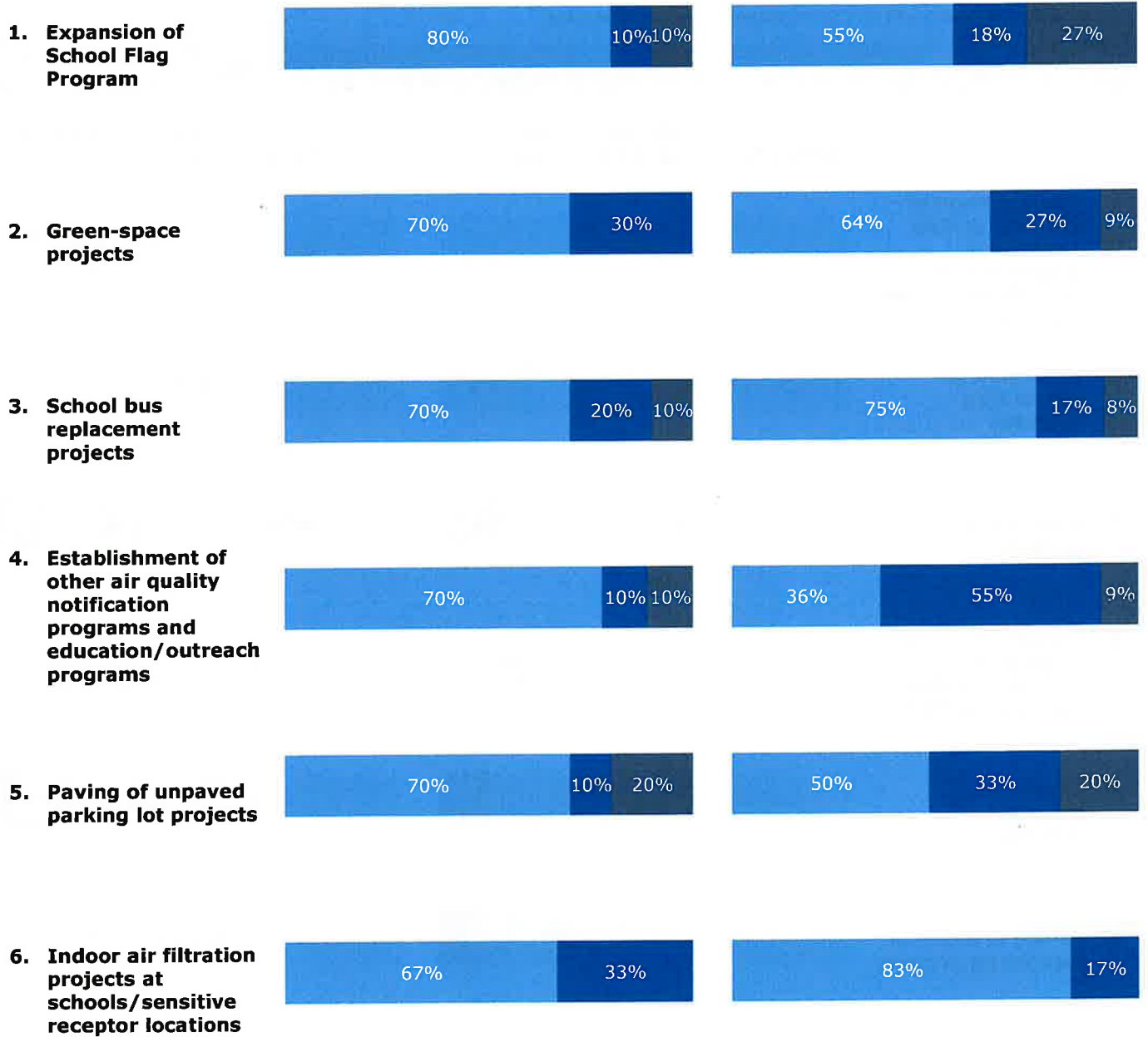


Level of favorability

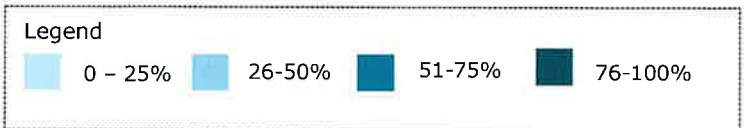
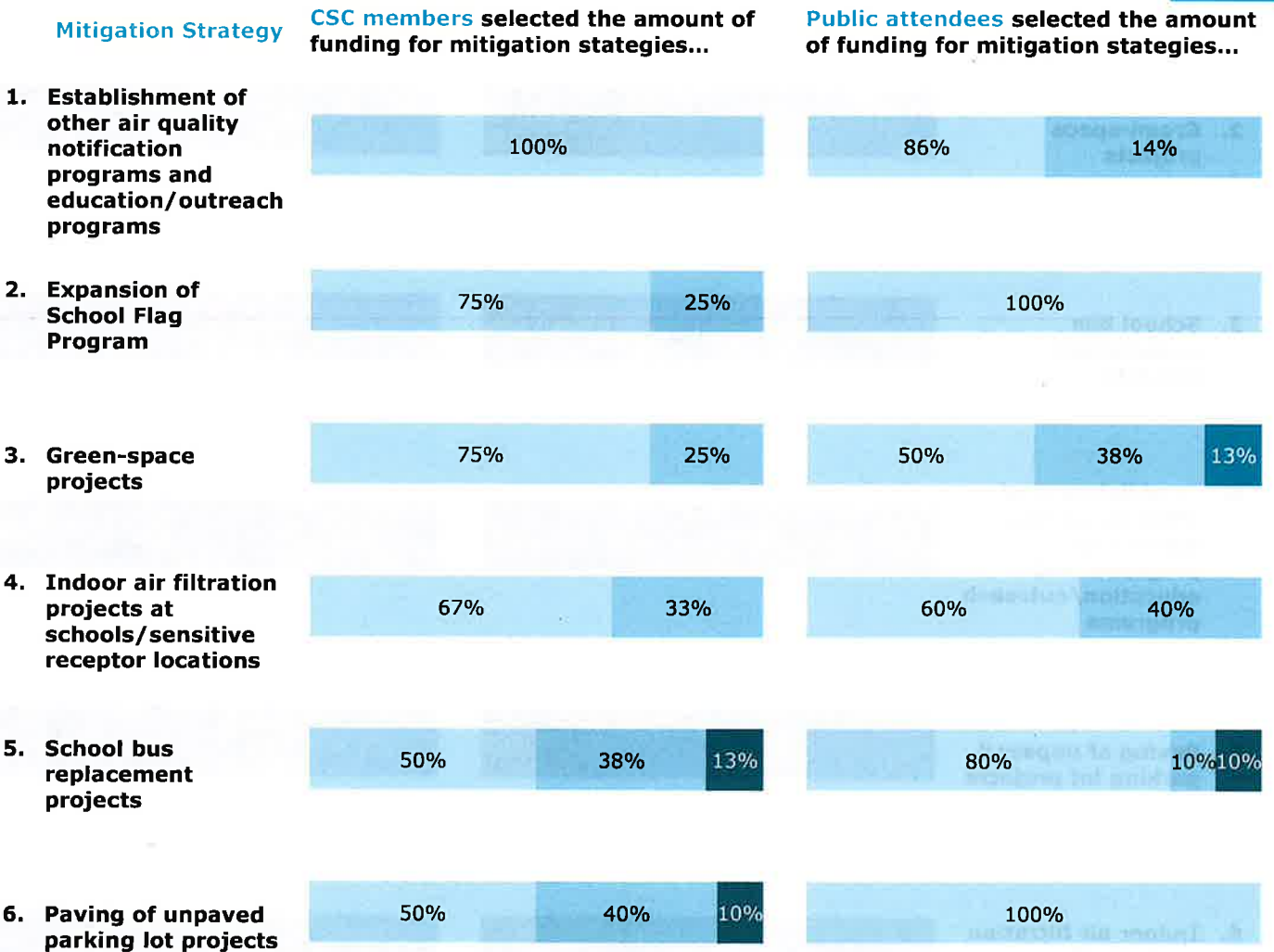
